PAYING BY CREDIT CARD

All fees may be paid by credit or debit card online at ce.lsu.edu/olli or by calling Enrollment Services at **225-578-2500**. This includes membership fees and course fees. Checks are no longer accepted. VISA, MasterCard, Discover, and American Express are accepted.

REFUNDS AND CANCELLATIONS
